## **Special Sense 2 (ENT) Patient Instructions**

- Patient Diagnosis: Otitis Externa
- Instructions for patient: Scratch inside of left ear
- Patient history:
  - o PC: Painful left ear
  - o HPC
    - Present for 7 days
    - 4/10 in severity
    - Present constantly
    - No triggers or exacerbating factors
    - Seen previously by GP, Acetic acid spray failed to relieve symptoms
  - Other symptoms
    - Itchy
    - Occasional discharge- non-bloody, "sticky"
  - Systems review
    - No blood, hearing impairment, headache, tinnitus
    - No weight loss, changes to taste or smell
  - o PMHx
    - Recall having multiple ear infections in childhood
    - Had Grommets at age 7
  - Drug Hx + Allergies: Paracetamol helps, No allergies
  - Family Hx: None
  - Social Hx: Professional swimmer, Social smoker, Drinks occasionally
  - o ICE
    - Ideas: Infection
    - Concerns: Worried about if due to excessive use of Q-tips
    - Expectations: Expecting to be told nothing serious
