Opening and Patient care

- Introduces themselves, gains consent and washes hands
- Correct positioning of patient
- Appropriate interaction during examination
- Ensures patient comfort during examination
- General inspection
- Appropriate examination of patient's surroundings
- General inspection of patient in relation to system being examined

Physical examination

- Inspects hand and nails
- Looks for Asterixis
- Assess temp of hand and palpates for contractures
- Inspects arms axilla, eyes, mouth
- Palpates lymph nodes
- Examines chest and abdomen
- Palpation, percussion and auscultation of abdomen
- Ballots kidneys and looks for shifting dullness
- Palpates liver and spleen

- States appropriate additional relevant investigations/ test
- Appropriate communication of clinical findings
- Confident, accurate and clear
