- Eyes: "Show image of Bilateral Exophthalmos" (Taken from NHS Website on 21/08/2022)
- Thyroid: "Show image of Midline Lump" (Taken from Lakeshoreent.com on 21/08/2022)





Other: No Proximal Myopathy, No Reflex abnormalities, No Pre-tibial Myxoedema

Palpation

- Hands: "Irregular elevated Pulse"

- Thyroid: "Right Lobe enlarged, Smooth, Painless"

- Lymph: No Lymphadenopathy

- Trachea: No Deviation

- Sternum: Normal Percussion

Ausculation of Thyroid

- Normal over each Lobe, No Bruits

Follow-up Questions

Q1: What is your Diagnosis? Hyperthyroidism/ Grave's

Q2: What investigations would you like to order?

TFTs, ECG, Ultrasound Neck, FBC, U&E, CRP, B12, Folate, Radio-uptake scan

Q3: She tells you she is a Nursery Teacher in her 1st Trimester of Pregnancy. How would you Manage this patient?

Propylthiouracil (4-6 weeks), Propanolol for symptom relief
