Patient demographics:

You are James Wells, a 34-year-old male who has come to the GP to discuss your diagnosis of Crohn's Disease.

Keep pressing your questions until you are satisfied with the answer from the student.

Understanding of the condition:

• "Autoimmune Inflammation that can happen anywhere from Mouth to Anus"

Concern 1:

• "What can I do in addition to Medications?"

Concern 2:

• "My friend takes Methotrexate for Arthritis, can I use that?

Concern 3:

• "If I'm not taking Methotrexate, do I still need to monitoring and Vaccines?"

Management and Information Giving – Notes for Candidate

Role: Foundation Year 1 doctor in a GP centre

This is James Wells, a 34-year-old male who has represented to the GP to discuss his diagnosis of Crohn's Disease.

You will need to establish the patient's understanding of the condition.

The patient will also request specific treatment. You will need to discuss this treatment, whether it is appropriate, and if so - how to administer it and the recognised side effects.

If the requested treatment is inappropriate, you should explain why.

The station will last 10 minutes but you will be notified by an invigilator at 8 minutes

Management and Information Giving – Examiner marksheet

- Good professionalism throughout
- Open and non-judgemental communication, natural flow to the conversation
- Shows empathy at appropriate times, doesn't come across as forced or unnatural
- Explores the patient's understanding of the condition and how it is spread primarily
 - CONCERN 1: Explain importance of a healthy balanced diet, avoiding any foods that appear to make symptoms worse. Emphasise that main change is to stop smoking.
 - CONCERN 2: Explain that Azathioprine/ Mercaptopurine recommended before MTX due to similar effectiveness, but higher rate of side effects with MTX (Myelosuppression, Pneumonitis etc)
 - CONCERN 3: Explain that Azathioprine/ Mercaptopurine will need enzyme testing. Explain need for regular blood tests and that patient should avoid Live vaccines. Should stay upto date with Annual Flu vaccine + One-off Pneumococcal.
